

## From the Supervisors Desk

Fellow Galway Residents,

The Fall of 2021 has been very busy around Town! Our 2nd Annual Halloween in the Park was the resounding highlight, hosted by over 35 Galway businesses and community groups. Approximately 500 area youth trick or treated along with their parents and grandparents. The weather held off long enough to allow everyone to collect a bucket full of candy and watch, special guests, the Wandering Witches entertain the crowd. It looks like this will be a yearly activity and put smiles on many faces!

At the beginning of October, unexpectedly, the Galway Town Clerk Margaret Defoe and her Deputy Clerk resigned. As I've come to know our town, we came together. The town board and I met and discussed options; subsequently, we felt that it was vital to town residents that they had access to community business, and we reopened Town Hall and began the process of hiring a new Town Clerk. On October 23, the Board held a special meeting and appointed Colleen Forneris as Town Clerk/Tax Collector and Brian Crowe as Deputy Town Clerk/Deputy Tax Collector.

I want to express my deep appreciation to both Colleen and Brian for stepping up to accept these positions, helping the Town open, and serving Galway's residents. I also want to thank Sue Wemple, the Providence Town Clerk, for her assistance with Colleen's transition and the town clerks in Charlton, Wilton, and Milton for their support. A special thank you to Pam Hargrave Wright for standing in as the recording secretary for our October meeting!

The pandemic has been particularly difficult for our elderly population. Thankfully, we have seen many of our senior programs begin again over the last few months, and people are getting back out. Recently, through the Office of the Aging, the county-wide Senior Meal program restarted, and we have begun hosting senior luncheons again at Town Hall. Every day, at noon, seniors over 55 can pre-register and enjoy a hot-cooked meal and some friendly conversation. Don't hesitate to contact Town Hall if you wish to attend.

Over the last year, we have allowed many more civic and youth groups to utilize Town Hall and the Town Park pavilion. We currently have an online usage form that must be completed, returned to Mrs. Forneris, and will be scheduled and confirmed through her. We cannot always guarantee use but will try to accommodate all requests.

### Tax Tips!

As we enter tax season, here are some helpful tips and guidelines:

There are several ways to pay your tax bill:

- In-person (please refer to the office hours)
- Online payments. These can be made by debit/credit card/e-check. Go to "townofgalwayny.org." Click on Departments/Tax Collector/Links/Town& County/Tax Bills

Please be aware that credit card/debit cards are subject to a service fee.

In addition to the above information, please note the following details:

- Beginning February 1st, there is a 1% penalty for payment.
- Starting March 1st, there is a 2% penalty, plus an additional \$1.00.
- March 31st is the last day payment can be accepted for 2022 Town & County Taxes. After this date, Saratoga County Treasurer's Office will need to be contacted at (518) 884-4724.

Please be certain that your correct contact number is listed on your check.

If your address has changed, you have received a bill for property that you no longer own, or you have paid off your escrow, please let us know as soon as possible to make the appropriate adjustments.

## Building Inspector/ Zoning Enforcement

I want to take the time to wish everyone a Happy Holiday Season. I hope it was enjoyable for everyone. I want to touch on a couple of things in this edition of the Galway Reader.

First, Pre-fab Sheds. New York State Building Code and Town Code recognize any structure over 144 sq. ft. requires a building permit. This includes Pre-fab sheds and or garages. They also need to follow our zoning laws regarding setbacks. Please get in touch with this office before placing any pre-fab structure.

Second, Effective January 1st, all plans submitted for a building permit must be 11" x 17" Single-sided. Plans of this size take up much less space when filing and allows us to scan them in-house. This is one more step in reducing the paper usage of this office. Commercial Plans and Surveys are exempt from this.

Third, By the time you read this article, we will be well into the heating season, the most common time of year to have a house fire or a carbon monoxide issue. Make sure your smoke and CO detectors are in working order. Have an emergency plan with your family and practice it. Have a meeting place. Keep warm clothes close to the exit points of your house and your car keys where you can find them in an emergency. A fire or CO alarm in the middle of the night when it's below zero out is not the time to develop an emergency plan.

Finally, we try to move building permits through our process as quickly as possible, and we do get behind but do our best. Please, plan for your permit, and make sure your application is complete when submitted. If you have questions when filling out an application, please contact me by phone or email.

## News from the Assessor's Office

The Assessor's Office is entering its busiest season – exemption administration! Exemption renewal forms have been mailed, and my office must receive all exemption applications by March 1, 2022.

If you are new to Galway and this is your primary residence, and you earn less than \$500,000, you may apply for the Basic STAR at the NYS Dept of Tax and Finance (website [www.tax.ny.gov](http://www.tax.ny.gov) or phone (518)457-2036) new owners qualifying for Senior Enhanced STAR also need to register with NYS Dept of Tax and Finance (same info as above). To be eligible for this exemption, you must be 65 years of age – sometime in 2022 or earlier, and your adjusted gross income cannot be more than \$92,000 for 2020.

Senior exemptions are available to anyone turning 65 in 2022 and meeting certain income requirements. Stop by and see if you qualify for more exemptions than you currently receive.

If you have questions or concerns regarding your assessment, the inventory on your property, or your exemptions, please do not hesitate to contact me. Grades 1 and 2 are held at the elementary gym on Saturdays and continue until February 12.


## Junior Rifle Club

Gather & Dine provides you with a safe and comforting environment. Chat with your neighbor, meet someone new, play a hand of cards, or a board game with friends.


All meals are \$2. If you are unable to pay, that's ok! This program is a service of the Saratoga County Office for the Aging.
